

THUNDER BAY CYCLING CLUB EVENT DISPUTE PROCEDURES

“In the event of a rules dispute (or infraction) an official protest may be submitted to settle a dispute. The nature of the protest shall be submitted *in writing* to a member of the Thunder Bay Cycling Club Executive (ie. the President) or the Race Director within 48 hours of the completion of the event.

Be sure to include the following information:

- A) When did the protested action occur? (event, date, approximate time)
- B) What is the nature of the protest? (ie. rules infraction, incident, safety issue)
- C) What are the specifics of the protest? (what happened)
- D) Was an official notified? (name, when)
- E) Name(s) of the rider(s) involved?
- F) Name(s) of witness(s)?
- G) Contact information for the person lodging the protest.
- H) What is the suggested corrective action?

You will be notified that the protest has been received and the Road Racing Committee will convene within 48hrs of receipt to review the protest. The parties involved may be contacted to provide further information. The Road Racing Committee will examine the facts and to provide a ruling based on UCI / CCA and the Thunder Bay Cycling Club rules. Appropriate discipline will be handed down and affected results will be corrected immediately following the Road Racing Committee's ruling.

If no protests are submitted within 48 hours of the completion of the event the results will stand.”
